Last call for summer camps at the Crucible Enrollment still open for adults, kids and families

You don't have to be a "burner" to enjoy taking classes at the Crucible. Burners are people who frequent the annual Burning Man Art Festival in the Nevada desert. But on Seventh Street in Oakland, home of the Crucible, you will find the best-equipped industrial arts studio on the West Coast and classes that do not exist elsewhere.

Consider the options: Medieval Helmet Making, Fearless Fire Eating (for beginners), and Plasma Sculpture – just some of the exotic examples of curriculum that fill The Crucible's 32-page catalog.

The Crucible has classes for kids and classes for adults, and some designed specifically for families. They even have summer camps.

A two-week summer camp starts next Monday, July 21, for adults, and then another one on August 4. For kids, there are two weeklong camps that begin July 28 and August 11.
